



Dear Friends -

The most characteristic Florida thing for me is the weather, but not just days full of long sunshine. No, I think of the days where there is a strange combination of sunshine up ahead and rain falling on your windshield at the same time. There are many names for it like, "sun shower," "liquid sunshine," even an old phrase I heard my aunt say "the devil is beating his wife." Whatever you call it, it's a strange phenomenon. Our lives can be a lot like that raining sunshine. There are times when it feels like clear skies and sunshine, but there are also the times that feel like a storm cloud is always overhead. Most of life is a combination of good and bad, joy and pain, sunshine and rain. The good news is that our Lord Jesus Christ promises to be with us in any weather. Seasons and storms will pass away, but our loving God remains the same. Look for hope amidst the hard times, and know that the times of darkness will pass away.

Church REBUILD Update

June Meeting info: Hurricane Michael not only badly damaged our building, but totaled three of our church vehicles and damaged a fourth. Working with our insurance settlement, the Trustees have recently purchased two 15 passenger buses (a 2018 and a 2017) to facilitate summer camps and other ministries. Both vehicles were program vehicles and had been used very little. In the coming weeks, we will put our logos on them and get them ready for a busy summer!

The Methodist Learning Center will be moving to a new and better location in — August. We have been approved for a FEMA Temporary Location Program and will be moving into the two buildings once operated by Busy Bee School on Long Avenue downtown. This will allow MLC to get back to its pre-hurricane enrollment, and allow the church space for ministry at the old Care Closet site on 4th Street (where MLC moved to after the storm). We are so excited about this opportunity!

On May 8, the Church REBUILD Committee met for its first meeting. The group reviewed the results of the church town-hall meeting and the "dream list" that the congregation developed. SPRC helped bring on staff a FEMA consultant, Sulzer Group, to help us with the FEMA grant process. The group also discussed the considerable damage of the MLC wing and the possibility of having to rebuild it to new codes and elevations.

On May 14, the Church REBUILD Committee met to continue the conversation. The group discussed ideas for the future and some temporary housing needs for the MLC. They spoke about a report from our engineer indicating that the bay-facing wall of the sanctuary could be structurally unsound and must be studied further.

For the time being, the sanctuary is off-limits and a greater boundary has been established around one side. At the end of the meeting, they hired Quina Grundhoeffer Architectural Firm through our RFQ process to design our REBULD project. The committee has promised to keep the congregation up to date as the plans unfold.


