Dear Friends,



Christ is risen! I love the story of the ancient Desert Father, John the Short. He was told by his "abba" or leader to go and plant a dead stick in ground. It was a strange request but that is what he did. Then his abba told him to water it every day. He did this for three years, and then miraculously the stick flowered and bore fruit.

It is so amazing how the season of Easter overlaps the winding down of the pandemic. Each week more and more are returning to in-person church. The choir has become vaccinated and is returning! Each week is like a homecoming. Our church is once again budding with new life and bearing fruit. It has been a tough year in so many ways, but it should not surprise us that that God does God's best work in times of crisis. We are an Easter people—and resurrection is in our DNA.

On Easter Sunday, we had more that 400 at the lighthouse service and at least 250 at the Church. What a great sign of life! This year we have been thinking about growth for our theme. God loves growth. However, I think Easter growth is different from developmental growth. Both kinds of growth are gifts from God. Developmental growth is from one stage to the next, life bringing or begetting more life. But Easter growth is when you don't expect it. It is the kind of growth that we have in trauma and crisis. It is the new life that comes out of death. Easter is always a surprise.

This season, I pray that all of us have some of that Easter growth. That God breathes new life into our dead places. That our deserts bloom, and our cemeteries become gardens of life. I think that God is calling us to the kind of faithfulness that John the Short had — to water every day. And a wait in hopeful expectation that new life is on the way.

Communion Sundays For in-person worshipers, we will have your communion kit on your seat when you come in so we don't have to break social distancing guidelines. We ask that you hold them in your hand during the Prayer of Great Thanksgiving, then we will all partake of them together. If you have any concerns about practicing communion in this manner, you are out of town, or cannot attend participate for health reasons, it is okay not to participate in it and receive "spiritual communion" instead. *Spiritual communion is a little known practice of the church that was developed during the Black Plague. Spiritual communion is when we are unable to take communion for various reasons, especially during a pandemic. All we have to do is long to take communion and pray for union with God in Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit will give us all spiritual benefits of Holy Communion. Here is a prayer to help you with this practice:

My Jesus, It is a New York when the Man Hall of Secure 2015.

In Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You.

For on-line worshipers in the area, we will be serving the communion kits to the passengers of vehicles lined up at the church drop off area from 11:00am-11:30am. Pastors Geoffrey and Chelsey will be wearing N-95 masks and using gloves to distribute the holy meal.

This is a state program launched with federal disaster aid funding to repair, rebuild, or replace eligible homes that still have remaining damage caused by Hurricane Michael.
