Dear Friends,



Someone once said, "Easter is the only time it is safe to put all your eggs in one basket." I guess that this is a humorous way of saying that our only viable strategy is resurrection. Paul says in 1 Cor 14, that if it were not for the Resurrection of Christ, our faith would be futile. It is in Easter that we put all our hope.

The promise of our faith is not that bad things won't happen—they do. It is that God works in them. Our mourning—God turns to dancing. Our sorrow—God turns to joy. The good news of Jesus is that Jesus brings us hope when we face hopeless situations. This means that we can have a strange confidence in the future, and peace in the present that "passeth understanding."

This Lent is a strange one for our church as we face pastoral transition. We have talked about it as time in the wilderness—where there are so many unknowns. But Easter teaches us that God has a plan for us—a destination. I am excited because I know how the story ends. I know that the best days of our church are ahead. I know that the wilderness moments are a gift and that God uses them to bring us to our next level. We have witnessed God's faithfulness through pestilence and storm. We know that God is faithful and the promise of Easter is true.

I know that financial advisors say that we need to diversify and not put all our eggs in one basket, but Easter looks like our only hope – and a glorious hope it is!

Mission Committee

First off, We want to thank everyone that purchased shirts for supporting missions. (Mission Committee is charged with Regional, National, and International Mission Support while the Caring Ministries handles all local missions.)

In support of regional missions, we decided we needed to support Disaster Relief. We have two areas from which to choose in order to support our district efforts: debris removal or home clean-up. Both require a trained team committed to travel on short notice and would be under the direction of the District "Disaster Pastor". We also discussed having a food trailer that would be able to provide meals for two or three days. This also would need a team of people ready to drop everything and go. We will be surveying the congregation shortly to determine the support we would have for any of these areas.

In support of national missions, we delivered clothing and linens to Kentucky for the Methodist Mountain Mission headquartered in Jackson, Kentucky. This is a project of the Kentucky Annual Conference and has a 79-year history. Thank-you Care Closet for your donations.

Like the rest of the world, we are focused on the Ukrainian Humanitarian Disaster. UMCOR's work in Ukraine is being funded with gifts to Advance #982450, International Disaster Response and Recovery. Grants for immediate relief have been given to United Methodist partners in Ukraine as well as neighboring nations—Poland, Hungary, Romania, and Slovakia—to support those who remain in Ukraine as well as those who have fled the violence. In addition, grants are being awarded to partners like ACT Alliance, a global faith-based coalition working in 120 countries around the world. These grants are providing humanitarian assistance in the form of food, water, clothing, shelter and other necessary supplies.
