

Growing up in poverty is one of the greatest threats to healthy child development. Poverty and financial stress can impede children's cognitive development and their ability to learn. It can contribute to behavioral, social and emotional problems, and poor health. That is why our church joined Highland View Baptist Church to provide weekend food bags for children with food insecurities at PSJ Elementary School in 2018. It is why this year, we are expanding our Blessing Bag Ministry to include Middle School students in poverty.

Last year, our ministry was funded completely by the generosity of our church family. Our church provided nearly 1000 Blessing Bags. That's 2,000 breakfasts, 2,000 lunches, 3,000 suppers, 3,000 snacks, and 2,000 fruits!! Well done Church!


