
Lent is almost here. I have been asked a number of times about what we are to do with our Lenten observances this year. Last year we started strong, but then the pandemic broke out and we called a halt to our fasts. The church decided long ago that when you are in the midst of a plague you do not fast. Instead, you do whatever is healthiest for you. Well, we are still in the pandemic, so this year we are not required to fast from anything. What we can do instead is commit to more healthy eating and exercise. Lent is not about giving things up it is about life. The word *lent* means spring. The whole season is about living into greater wholeness and healing in our bodies, souls, and spirits. This season is about eternal life, for sure, but it is also about regular life.

I have had many people thank our church for all of the ways we have practiced pandemic mitigation and education during the last year. I usually say, "thank you, it is who we are as Methodists!" John Wesley's most popular book was a health book, *Primitive Physique*. He advocated for scientific advancements in medicine and his home was filled with primitive exercise and medical equipment. Our denomination has been focused on global health, which I have witnessed personally in Tanzania. For over a decade our biggest mission was *Imagine No Malaria*, where we drastically reduced deaths due to that terrible virus. It was a huge success and many groups joined our effort including the NBA. It is no surprise that Methodists everywhere have tried our best to do our part to fight the virus. John Wesley would have been excited about the advancements in medicine including vaccination. We are encouraging everyone who qualifies to seek the Covid-19 vaccination when it becomes available. Jesus' ministry was not just spiritual but he healed the sick everywhere he went. Let us all continue this ministry of health and healing during the season of Lent. It is a great time to lose a few pounds, lower your cholesterol or sugar, and schedule a check up. Our heath matters to God and there is much that we can do about it so that we might have life (physical health) and have it more abundantly (spiritual health).



Communion Sundays For in-person worshipers, we will have your communion kit on your seat when you come in so we don't have to break social distancing guidelines. We ask that you hold them in your hand during the Prayer of Great Thanksgiving, then we will all partake of them together. If you have any concerns about practicing communion in this manner, you are out of town, or cannot attend participate for health reasons, it is okay not to participate in it and receive "spiritual communion" instead. \*Spiritual communion is a little known practice of the church that was developed during the Black Plague. Spiritual communion is when we are unable to take communion for various reasons, especially during a pandemic. All we have to do is long to take communion and pray for union with God in Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit will give us all spiritual benefits of Holy Communion. Here is a prayer to help you with this practice:

\*\*My Jesus,\*\*
I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.

My Jesus,
I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.
I love You above all things,
and I desire to receive You into my soul.
Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally,
come at least spiritually into my heart.
I embrace You as if You were already there
and unite myself wholly to You.
Never permit me to be separated from You.
Amen.

For on-line worshipers in the area, we will be serving the communion kits to the passengers of vehicles lined up at the church drop off area from 11:00am-11:30am. Pastors Geoffrey and Chelsey will be wearing N-95 masks and using gloves to distribute the holy meal.

# Finish Strong: An Update on Our Coronavirus Policy

We are getting close to the finish line, so let's finish strong. Many people in our community are currently receiving vaccinations and in the coming months the pandemic will be coming to an end in our community. Our church has done so well with mitigating the effects of the pandemic and complying with our church pandemic policy. With the recent rise in cases and in the positivity rate, we are reviewing our policies and their implementation. We are asking all of our members to redouble efforts to protect each other and the most vulnerable among us. People are required to wear masks inside church buildings, including those who have received Covid-19 vaccinations. For children and youth functions, masks are only required for adult volunteers. We are all taking special precautions for Sunday morning worship in regards to social distancing, air-flow, and no-contact worship elements (communion, bulletins, etc.). We have instructed that each ministry area review and redouble their efforts. We also will have limited adult in-person options for the first part of 2021. This means that the Care Closet will also have limit in-person opportunities until the local conditions improve. It won't be long now until we can safely embrace one another and bare our radiant faces in worship. This difficult period of time will be one of our memories of the way that we have cared for one another and the least of these.




