Thanks be to God!



FEBRUARY SERIES OVERVIEW: Have you ever been hurt so badly by someone that you desperately wanted revenge? When we're treated cruelly or unfairly, it's natural to want justice. But what does "justice" really mean? Is it only about handing out consequences and punishment to the people who have wronged us? Or could it be about something more? How do we balance forgiveness and grace with truth and consequences? There's someone in the Old Testament of the Bible whose life has a lot to teach us about justice. In this 4-week series, the story of Joseph will help us see that justice is love in action and that when we're wronged by others. us see that **justice** is **love** in action and that, when we're wronged by others, we can hold on to hope, trust that integrity can withstand injustice, and learn to practice justice that restores what's broken.

### Vicki Abrams, Methodist Caring Ministries



In April of 2021, First United Methodist Church opened the Methodist Care Center. The Methodist Care Center is home to the Methodist Care Closet, Two Fish Food Market, The Blessing Bags Program and provides space for the Citizens of Gulf County Recovery Team and serves as the Church's operations center for community-based supports for residents of Gulf County and Mexico Beach. Through these programs, our Church is able to connect with and assist many of our neighbors. Except for one part-time employee for the Care Closet, the Methodist Care Center is operated by a group of dedicated and passionate volunteers. These volunteers not only serve the mission of the Care Center, but are also developing friendships that expand beyond their volunteer hours. It should be noted our volunteers come from multiple churches across the county.

Two Fish Food Market opened its doors on April 20<sup>th</sup> with 3 enrolled households (families). By early August the goal of 150 families had been exceeded and by the end of December, 264 families were enrolled as shoppers. On a monthly basis, approximately 50% of our enrolled family's shop up to 2 times per month securing perishable and non-perishable food items based on the number of individuals living in their home. We are continuously amazed at the generosity of our congregation and community and through their gifts were able to provide Thanksgiving and Christmas baskets for families who shop at Two Fish. Two Fish could not meet the needs of so many without our group of dedicated volunteers. They make shoppers feel "right at home" and many times help connect them to other services in our community. Most important is Two Fish Food Market has made life a little easier for some of most vulnerable neighbors.


