Dear Friends,



Every time we say the creed together we affirm that one of the most basic beliefs that we have is in the “holy catholic church.” Every so often I get asked what this means for us as United Methodists. Do we believe in the Roman Catholic Church? What about the Pope? What does it mean to be catholic? These are great questions. The word *catholic* means universal. To say the church is *catholic* is to affirm that we are universal or diverse. We are a world-wide body made up of many tribes and tongues. The second chapter of the Book of Acts reminds us that when the Holy Spirit moves, God brings many different kinds of people together into one body. By placing this in the creed, the church has said that to not believe that the church is catholic or diverse is to be trapped in heresy.

Today it seems that nationalism is on the rise all around the globe, even in our own country. People are retreating to their own tribes and to their own interests, and racial tensions have been rising. What if the church stepped forward and said that our citizenship in the kingdom of heaven was more determinative of who we are than belonging to any tribe, race, or nation? What if the waters of baptism said more about us than our DNA or ethnic origin? What if we thought of every stranger as a potential citizen of heaven?

As you can see, not being a heretic is hard. When churches split and become less diverse, that is a sign of spiritual weakness. However, when diverse people are brought together from different backgrounds, different beliefs, and different races, then we know that it could be nothing other than God’s Holy Spirit. I have seen evidence of God’s Spirit moving in our church and town. God is bringing us together and every day we look more like the church that we confess we believe in. Praise the Lord!

### UMCOR - Let's Go Somewhere and Do Something Good!

On April 22, the 2017 United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) team from our church was recognized with certificates at both services. This was followed by a slide show on April 25 of their week spent working in the depot on the Sager-Brown campus and in the communities of Baldwin, and Franklin, Louisiana. It is now time to show commitment to, "Being United" with those in need for 2018. Dates are December 2-7, with a \$25 deposit due, August 20. For 11 years, we have served this mission and have 20 slots to fill with able bodies and helping hands. Sager-Brown is a special place with a history of impacting people in Bayou Teche by offering a positive ministry, with necessary outreach. Its campus has functioned as an orphanage, school for gifted African-American students, and site of relief efforts following natural disasters, world-wide. Each year, more than 3,000 volunteers help in coordinating shipments of cleaning supplies, hygiene kits and school bags. Last year, our group shared fellowship with teams from Texas, Tennessee, New Mexico, North Carolina and Arkansas. In addition to work in the warehouse packing flood buckets, several of last year's group assisted in the sewing room, and wood shop. Others also worked alongside victims of domestic abuse at Chez Hope, young residents at The Bridge-Women's Teen Challenge Center, and at the thrift store that aids Matthew 25 International. The UMCOR experience is really for young, and old! There is no shortage of opportunities to pitch in, but you can set your own pace. The Care Closet had a great 1st quarter in 2018. We had excellent Sales, Profits, and Donations. (See Financial Statement below)

The Care Closet recently reached the \$307,000 mark in sales. That dollar amount equates to over 750,000 items of clothing sold. That doesn't even count the 75,000 pieces of clothing we have given at no cost to the needy people of our community. After expenses, all profits are donated back to our community or Church for many worthwhile community or mission projects and the individual needs of the people of our community. We have given \$199,674 or 97.5% of our \$204,817 profit back to our Church or community. We currently are receiving over 1,500 items of clothing donations each week. We can't thank the people of our community enough for the unbelievable support we receive from them in donating clothing each and every week.
