**Guest Speaker Sunday, May 2: Rev. Thaddeus Searcy** Rev. Thaddeus Searcy responded to the call to ministry at a very early age. In 2001, he helped plant New Covenant Ministries in Charleston, IL. This church plant reached out to minority students of his alma mater Eastern Illinois University with the gospel of Jesus Christ and provided counseling and hope to the under-served of that community. In 2005, Rev. Searcy joined All Nations Community Church in Homewood, IL as Lead Pastor for Young Adults. In 2007, he became the youngest person ever called to the senior pastorate of Cross and Crown Community Church - a multi-ethnic community church located in the heart of Albany Park on the north side of Chicago. Searcy to pioneer a church that's full of life and freedom aptly named Freedom Church in Lansing, IL. # **Blessing Bags Ministry and Two Fish Food Market**




