Dear Friends,



On May 8, we will confirm nine young people. It is a high and holy moment to hear them confess their faith in public and vow to live a Christians. I have had the pleasure of getting to know them-watching many of them grow up-and know that our future is in good hands. Confirmation is marked by the laying on of hands. I think that is pretty amazing to think about all the hands involved through the ages. The word tradition in Greek means "handed." While Methodists do not believe in doctrine of Apostolic Succession like our Catholic and Anglian friends, we do practice it. Bishop Goodpastor laid his hands on me many years ago, and you can trace seven hands back to John Wesley, our founder. From him the list includes a who's who of Christianity: St. Anslem, St. Augustine of Canterbury, St. Irenaus, and then to Peter and Paul. One hundred hands away is Jesus. We have an unbroken link

to Jesus that is made of people like you and me. It is remarkable to think that we have this tactile direct link to him through the ages.

Our forbearers have handed us a great faith that is centered on the gospel of Jesus Christ. It is our job to keep the tradition alive by handing it on to the next generation. In the act of Confirmation we will all get to see it happen in real life. Let us not forget the words of St. These of Avila, "Your hands are the hands of Christ."

Church Council Statement of PSJFUMC

After hearing the presentation by Geoffrey on "What is Happening in the United Methodist Church" Wednesday evening, March 23, some of us thought it would be helpful if we considered who we are as a church. It appears that the only churches stating their intentions are those wishing to disaffiliate. We believe that our fellow United Methodists need to understand that most United Methodist Churches wish to remain United Methodist. Working from an initial draft, we thoroughly discussed, edited, and wordsmithed what we believe to be where PSJFUMC stands. The statement was adopted by unanimous vote of our Church Council. It reads as follows:

The Church Council of First United Methodist Church of Port St. Joe, Florida declares its love and support of our denomination, the United Methodist Church. During this divisive time where there is splintering in our denomination and fracturing in the wider culture, the leaders of our congregation wish to thank our denomination for offering an alternative-unity in Christ. We are especially grateful for the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) which greatly supported our town's recovery from Hurricane Michael, and our joint missions around the world especially our partners in Tanzania, and our mission to Ukraine. Our church seeks to be a church where everyone is welcome, where all persons can become disciples of Jesus Christ. We welcome conservatives, progressives, and anyone in between to follow Jesus with us and live out his coming kingdom. Where our denomination and church are in error, we pray for reform, and where we are spiritually stagnant, we pray for revival. We are committed to remaining in the United Methodist Church with Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors.
