In this life we will face hardships and challenges of many kinds, but we have a **Great Hope in a Mighty God** who continues even now to strengthen, help, and uphold each one of us for all time. "Households enrolled: We now have over 200 families enrolled to shop 2 x per month. During the month of September, about half of our enrolled families did not shop. In previous months, we learned some families had been away for the summer while others no longer needed this support. We will continue to follow up as appropriate. There is a core group of households that shop twice per month with many others shopping only once per month. Another number stands out; 33% of enrolled members have a Wewahitchka address. This represents Howard Creek, Overstreet, and Wewahitchka proper. Transportation barriers may contribute to these families shopping only once per month. Volunteers: Loretta and I cannot say enough about the Two Fish Volunteers. There is a dedicated group of around 25 volunteers who serve each week, logging more than 300 volunteer hours during the month of September. That is valued at more than \$8,500.00. We are thankful David Warriner has come home from NC - he is one of the dedicated stockers! We also want to thank Kristen Tusing for her volunteer work while Kristen and the children were at their home in St Joe Beach during Matt's deployment. At the end of this week, they will relocate with Matt to Abilene where Matt is now serving as a federal prosecutor. Thank You Kristen!

Sign-up Genius - Volunteers are using the Sign-up Genius app to schedule their volunteer time. After just a few weeks of using in October and now scheduling November, I call it a success! Judy Williams has shared with me one of the data reports available from Sign-up Genius that will track our volunteer hours. We may be able to eliminate pencil and paper check-in by using this technology. Thank You Judy for your guidance with this app.


