I am going to try my hardest to not go over the catalogue of personal damages, lost heirlooms, and community losses. Maybe there will be years to do that kind of thing in the future.

But this year, I have decided that for me the only way to approach this day is with celebration. I plan to have a party. I will be out of town on a Celtic Spiritual Pilgrimage during the anniversary. I had this trip on my calendar for over a year and almost canceled it, but decided that it might just be the best way to commemorate that day. I know that our community is planning a celebration at the Lighthouse Park called *Rise Up*. I hope it is a great celebration.

We have a lot to celebrate:

I plan to celebrate how our community has become a family bound by something deeper than a zip code.

I plan to celebrate how we became a community where neighbor helps neighbor despite our differences.

I plan to celebrate all of the people who came from all over to help clean out our homes and take down our trees.

I plan to celebrate having a new house and new furniture.

I plan to celebrate the Long Term Recovery efforts and UMCOR.

I plan to celebrate life; we are all survivors.

We have come so far since that day, and no doubt we have a long way to go. God has brought us through the sea and through the storm to a better place. I want to encourage you not to spend too much time remembering the trauma and loss, but instead celebrate how far we have come and the strength we have found. Let's celebrate!

Friends,

As we draw closer to October 10, the anniversary of Hurricane Michael, a multitude of emotions race through my head. Some of you watched from afar and experienced the uncertainty if friends or loved ones were safe, while some of you were quite literally in the eye of the storm. It took days to assess the safety of our clergy and their families, as well as the condition of United Methodist churches along the Florida Panhandle. Our conference leadership team and I visited the area as soon as it was deemed safe to enter. If you did not see the devastation in person, there are simply no words to express the destruction and chaos that Hurricane Michael left behind. It was a helpless feeling. As your Bishop, I am supposed to have answers and plans to lead you through times of despair but even the best plans cannot prepare you for a category five hurricane.

As I reflect on this past year, I am so humbled to see the progress in the panhandle communities. It will take years to rebuild but little by little, we have come so far. For that progress, I give thanks and celebrate the thousands of people who contributed their gifts, service and witness. From clergy in surrounding areas who quickly mobilized supplies and figured out delivery logistics; to our clergy in the damaged areas who put their own personal needs aside to help their church members and communities; to conference staff and the Hurricane Michael recovery team; I am reminded of the need for this connection. If you simply gave \$10 or donated a toothbrush, you made a difference. I've said it before and I will say it again: we are at our best in the worst of times.

We have a long-term commitment to this area, that we will walk alongside these communities until there is no longer a need. We still need your help. We invite you to pray with us, make a donation and send teams. More information can be found at <u>www.hurricanemichaelrecovery.org</u>. The local church is where our vital ministries are. Join me in making this recovery process a priority. I give thanks to your church for your participation and leadership.


