

Dear Friends,



"It is just a building," they say; "the church is the people." But I disagree at least with the first part – it is not "just" a building. One of the things that makes Christianity so different from more "spiritual" religions is that we believe that God has not stayed put in the heavenly realms, but instead has come down into space and time to be with us. For Christians, this means that space becomes set apart or holy. God came to be with Israel in slavery and journeyed with them to the Promised Land, and God has come down in the person of Jesus to be with the world. So for Christians, bodies are important and so are buildings. God works through and in people and places, through bread and wine and water. In other words, God takes up space.

Since 1950, people have brought their most sacred moments to this building. We presented our newborns for the blessing of baptism, we committed to our trueloves with the vows of marriage, we gave our lives to Christ at the altar of faith, and we have said farewell to our loved ones in Christian funeral. Thousands of people for generations have had sacred interactions in this special place. It is not "just" a building. It is holy ground.

On October 10, 2018 Hurricane Michael destroyed the Sanctuary of First United Methodist Church of Port St. Joe, Florida – our house of worship for many generations. The beautiful stained glass shattered from wind and wave. The dark wood of the pews and wainscoting became covered in salt. Our high steeple was twisted by the elements. The sturdy block and brick walls came tumbling down. Even the historic altar, pulpit, and font floated away. We have looked at this wreckage for three years – an ever present reminder of the injury that our community had sustained.

This October, what is left of the building comes down, and we will mourn. We will commit to God this sacred place like a family standing in the hot sun of a cemetery. We will stare at the dirt and dust that remains and grieve. And yet, Christian funerals are not devoid of hope. Our faith teaches that death can lead to resurrection and that endings can be beginnings. It is not "just" a building, and one day soon on the same holy ground a new red-brick building with stained glass will rise from the ashes and dust, its tower pointing heavenward. And, one day, we will all exclaim the words of the book of *Revelation*, "See, the home of God is among mortals. He will dwell with them; they will be his peoples, and God himself will be with them."


Children's Ministry


