As we go back to school, in Pastor's Bible Study we will be studying the Book of James. While traditionally called an 'epistle' or letter, scholars note that its true Biblical genre is wisdom literature. This means that it has more in common with Proverbs than with 1 Corinthians. In James, we find little narrative or applications to specific problems, instead we find universal advice on how to stay humble, to watch what we say, and to not show favoritism. What we have in James is a collection of Christian proverbs meant to give us all help in navigating the troubled waters of life.


The whole genre of wisdom literature in scripture is a helpful corrective in our Information Age. We have all the knowledge of the world available at our fingertips. We even have Siri and Alexis to respond to our vocal inquiries! We have access to more knowledge than any people in human history, but what has it gotten us? In our Information Age, we have a wisdom deficit. Wisdom and knowledge are not the same thing. Knowledge is about *information*, but wisdom is about *formation*. Knowledge answers the questions of 'what' and 'when', while wisdom answers 'how' and 'why.'

As we go back to school this month, let us recommit to learning. There is a lot of information that we must learn, but let us focus more on wisdom – God's wisdom. As Jesus' little brother says, "If any off you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you (James 1:5)." I am making that my prayer.

The Care Closet, Vic LaFerle



The Care Closet had a great 2nd quarter in 2018. We had sales of \$6,515. This brings our total sales CY1997 thru the 2nd quarter of 2018 to \$313,466. After operating expenses in the 2nd quarter of 2018 we made a net profit of \$3,695 This brings our total profit from CY 1997 thru the 2nd quarter of 2018 to \$208,512. (See Financial Statement below). We were able to donate \$202,824 or 97.2 % of our profit back to our community or Church for many worthwhile community mission projects and the individual needs of the people of our community. I was not only impressed by the fact that the Care Closet was able to donate \$202,824 but to who and where the donations were made to.

A breakdown of the donations is as follows:

As you can see by the above a very impressive \$171,674 or 84% of all donations made by the Care Closet were donated back to our local Church or our community.

The \$313,466 in sales thru the 2nd quarter of 2018 equates to over 800,000 items of donated clothing sold or given away at no cost. We currently are receiving over 1,400 items of clothing donations each week. We can't thank the people of our community enough for their unbelievable support we receive from them in donating clothing each week.

The main reason the Care Closet has been such an outstanding success in the past and will continue to be in the future is because of a small group of dedicated people from our church and community who have given so unselfishly of their time and effort in supporting the Care Closet. They are the driving force that makes the Care Closet mission and outreach program such an outstanding success.


