# 2018 FUMC PSJ UMCOR Team

In 2007, the late Diana Wilder (wife of Walter Wilder), invited Skip Griffies to speak to her UMW mission group about his experience serving at the disaster relief warehouse in Baldwin, Louisiana. This facility prepares and verifies relief kits for disaster-stricken areas around the world. Following his presentation, 16 volunteers were interested in attending. Since that time and up through December 2018, 12 teams have traveled to this facility to work in this capacity. The teams have also completed home repairs, built a handicapped ramp, visited and worked in shelters for women and children.

In December 2018, our team traveled to Baldwin, Louisiana's UMCOR Depot and participated in the assembling and packing of 931 flood buckets and 1200 plus health kits, the construction of a handicap ramp for a needy family, planting of a community garden, and for the 12th straight year the setting up the campus Nativity Scene. We hope that this mission will continue to be a vital part of First United Methodist Church of Port St. Joe. If you would like to be a

UMCOR operates two supply depots, the UMCOR Sager Brown Depot is in Baldwin, Louisiana and UMCOR Depot West in Salt Lake City, Utah. The United Methodist Church also collaborates with a network of United Methodist Relief-Supply Warehouses across the United States. Church donators can send or drop off kits and supplies at the depot nearest to them, assured that their donations will be received and distributed by UMCOR.

The UMCOR Sager Brown Depot is the hub of UMCOR's relief-supply operations. Each year, more than 2,000 volunteers prepare about \$6 million in supplies for shipment from the Baldwin facility. Locally, UMCOR Sager Brown reaches out to Baldwin neighbors through food distribution and housing rehabilitation projects, engaging volunteers in these projects that help families and the elderly. At a shelter for survivors of domestic abuse and at a women's teen challenge center for drug and alcohol addiction, our volunteers provide assistance with painting rooms and sorting items in their Thrift Shops and Food Pantries. To help meet the nutritional needs of local children, volunteers distribute food items to parents from the Pre-School Food Pantry at a local Head Start school. Also, Sager Brown Volunteers have opportunity to read to children at some local Head Start Centers.

Dear Friends,



Happy New Year! I am confident that 2019 is going to be a great year for us. The Book of Ecclesiastes says that there is a time for everything—to break down and to build up. This year is one of rebuilding. The past few months have been a time of communal mourning. We have mourned the loss of our homes that have been damaged or destroyed, our friends that have had to move away, and our community as we have known it. These losses are so great that we will continue to grieve for many, many years.

However, as we shift to a new year, I believe, as Bob Dylan sang, "the times they are a-changing." God is calling us to move to a new time. To borrow from Ecclesiastes 3, the time to tear down is coming to an end, and the time for rebuilding is coming. The time for mourning is coming to an end, and a time for dancing is coming. The time of death is coming to an end; it is time for birth and new life.

In the next few weeks, we will be developing a campus wide rebuilding strategy. We have been approved for a large FEMA public assurance grant to defer much of the cost, plus we have been given amazing gifts from all over the country (over half a million!). We hopefully will be able to put our project out to bid in March. This year will be one of rebuilding for our church and we will come back better and stronger.

We also will have an UMCOR operation center in Port St. Joe to help families in our community who do not have the resources to rebuild their homes. I am so excited about what this will mean for our community. We are called to rebuild the homes in our community.

Finally, I believe that we are called to rebuild our lives and to rebuild our community itself. God is calling us to lead our community to a better place. It is time for us to rebuild spiritually and physically.

Our theme this year is REBUILD. The good news is that we do not have to do it alone. The Lord is rebuilding for us and with us. Psalm 127:1 says, "unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it build it in vain." Let us join the Lord in God's rebuilding effort for our church, our homes, and our lives.


