

Assistant Professor of Wesleyan and Methodist Studies at Candler School of Theology at Emory University. PhD, Southern Methodist University, 2012 MDiv, Wesley Theological Seminary, 2005

BA, University of Oklahoma, 2002

Before joining the Candler faculty in 2014, The Rev. Dr. Kevin M. Watson taught at Seattle Pacific University and Perkins School of Theology.

Dr. Watson's research interests focus on Christian formation and discipleship from a Wesleyan perspective, particularly communal formation, Wesleyan/Methodist Christianity, the history of early Methodism, American Methodism, common misunderstandings of the Wesleyan tradition, and current events in The United Methodist Church. He has written numerous articles for both scholarly and popular publications, as well as several books, including *Pursuing Social Holiness: The Band Meeting in Wesley's Thought and Popular Methodist Practice* (Oxford University Press, 2014). Watson is also an ordained elder in the Oklahoma Conference of The United Methodist Church. He and his wife Melissa have three children.

Hi Everyone, I am writing this as we experience a sub tropical storm. I have also been without electricity now for the last 5 hours. So my husband and I finally decided that it was probably time to turn on the generator. Our optimism that the electric would return soon has turned into the reality that is "probably not". It is with this backdrop that we usher in Summer Vacation.

UMW will be taking a summer break. This year we held two very successful fundraisers. This enables us to fund our mission work-locally, regionally, and globally. Two of the projects we have completed during this past five months are our Give A Book Program and the UMCOR White Shoebox Project.

In one we give a book to every child enrolled in PortSt. Joe Elementary School. This book is their book to keep. It will either be a welcomed edition to a child's already established library or it will be the beginning of a library. It is our way to let children know how important reading is to educational success. It is our way of conveying onto them and nurturing a love of reading.

In the White Shoebox Project we fill shoeboxes with toys, school supplies, hygiene supplies and items of clothing. These boxes are meant to meet the needs of children aged infant to 12 years. We filled 59 boxes. These boxes will be sent to UMCOR in Louisiana. From there they will be shipped to Methodist Missionaries around the world. We also write a check to UMCOR to cover the shipping charges for our 59 boxes.
