

Dear Friends,



Our youth and children's programs have been learning about the Plagues of Egypt recently. The story is in Exodus, when the people of Israel have been living as slaves in Egypt and the trials they faced. After years of mistreatment, God anoints leaders to help them leave Egypt. Moses and Aaron stand before Pharaoh and say the iconic, "Let my people go!" And what does Pharaoh say? "Nope."

Thus starts the back and forth of miraculous signs of God's powers and the stubbornness of the Pharaoh in his refusal to let the people of Israel leave. Pharaoh won't let the people leave, despite the plagues of bloody water, frogs, gnats, flies, dead livestock, boils, hail, locusts, and total darkness. If we are honest, we can all think of a time we have broken the Lord's commandments because of our hardness of heart.

Perhaps it isn't to the extreme of enslaving an entire group of people, but we have refused the commands of God because we didn't want to suffer loss. Pharaoh would have lost his free labor and stable economy, among other things, but what do we risk when we follow the commands of God?

Living the Christian life is not always easy. The bumper stickers of "Too Blessed to be Stressed" are catchy but more of a hope than an honest reflection of our human experience. Following the motto of "What Would Jesus Do?" is not without difficulties and loss.

We could lose friendships by seeking to live a life not only free of speaking gossip, but also by speaking against gossip heard. We could lose relationships if we choose to live a life of radical devotion to the teachings of Jesus. We could lose our security.

All four gospels talk about losing our lives in Jesus. I surely hope this does not mean a quick mortality for all of us, but I do think it speaks of a loss of a kind of life. A comfortable life in which we indulge in our sinful nature is a life that Christ calls us to leave, God commands we let go.

But, the joy of letting something go, is that we are open to be filled with something even greater. Will you risk the plagues to stick to your stubborn ways or will you risk what you know to find security in the commandments of our loving Savior?
